Jovibarba	<i>Jovibarba heuffelii</i>	Introduced	pale yellow	Early summer	6 inches - 12 in bloom	yes	yes	Jovibarba heuffelii is a cousin of Sempervivum that doesn't make offsets. Multiple heads grow on a single, thickened rootstock. The plant blooms with pale yellow flowers, every year without dying. Plants propagated by cutting into quarters, each section with at least a small part of the parent stock at the base. Hardy to at least zone 5. These get <u>quite</u> large.
Sedum 'Autumn Joy'	<i>Sedum sp.</i> 'Autumn Joy'	Introduced	pink	fall	2 ft	no	yes	Unmatched classic cultivar. Late summer blooms adored by honeybees. Fertilized flowers turn dark pink and continue the show into winter.
Sedum 'Matrona'	<i>Sedum sp.</i> 'Matrona'	Introduced	Pink flowers, burgundy stems	late summer	28 - 30 inches	no	somewhat	A tall, stunning garden beauty with blue-green foliage, burgundy stems, and pink flowers.
Sedum 'Vera Jameson'	<i>Sedum sp.</i> 'Vera jameson'	Introduced	pink	Summer	10 - 12 inches	no	somewhat	A low spreading succulent with round smoky blue leaves and dusky pink star flowers in late summer. A tough, easy to grow plant, for a hot dry location.

Sedum 'Purple Emperor'	<i>Sedum</i> sp. 'Purple Emperor'	Introduced	dusky pink-purple flowers, purple stems & leaves	mid-summer	15 inches	no	somewhat	Dark purple succulent leaves and dusky purple-pink flowers.
Sedum 'October Daphne'	<i>Sedum sieboldii</i> 'October Daphne'	Introduced	pink	fall	4 - 6 inches	pink	somewhat	Low growing sedum with gray-green leaves forming a neat little clump with bright pink flowers. Sun-part shade Zone: 3-8
Wormleaf Stonecrop	<i>Sedum stenopetalum</i>	L	yellow	Early summer	4 - 6 inches	semi-evergreen	yes	An ugly name for a beautiful local succulent species.
Spiny Fameflower	<i>Talinum spinescens</i>	L	Hot pink	Summer	less than one inch: flower stems 4 - 6 inches	yes	extremely	Amazing high summer bloomer: blooms after 2 PM on the hottest days of the year in the hottest rocky soil sites. Long blooming. Reseeds lightly in a good location.
